Sorrowful Mysteries – Tuesdays/Fridays Agony in the Garden (Mark 14:32-42). For all whose lives are in agony, body, mind and spirit because of Covid-19 and for all who are trying to help them. Scourging at the Pillar (Matt 27:26). For the victims of all forms of domestic violence brought about due to the stress of Covid-19.

<u>Crowing with Thorns (Mark 15:16-20)</u>. For all suffering from depression and headaches as a result of Covid-19.

<u>Jesus Carries His Cross (Mark 15:21-22)</u>. For all carrying a cross of working long hours and placing their lives at risk as they care for others during this time.

<u>Jesus dies on the Cross (Mark 15:23-41)</u>. For all who have died during this global pandemic and for their grieving loved ones. For all who have had to postpone funeral <u>services</u>.

Joyful Mysteries – Mondays/Saturdays Annunciation (Luke 1:26-38). For the protection of all women carrying an unborn child at this time, especially those carrying an unplanned or unwanted child.

<u>Mary visits her Cousin Elizabeth (Luke 1:39-45)</u>. For all who live and work in nursing homes, rehabilitation centers and hospitals. For the elderly who cannot receive visits from family members.

Birth of Jesus (Luke 2:1-8). For children born into poverty and unhealthy and unloving family situations. Presentation of Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:22-28). For all who have had to postpone Baptisms, First Communion, Entrance into Full Communion with our Church.

Finding of Jesus in the Temple (Luke 2:41-50). For all missing children and their grieving loved ones.

Glorious Mysteries – Wednesdays/Sunday <u>The Resurrection (Mark 16:1-20)</u>. In thanksgiving for all those who were brought low with Covid-19 and are now doing well.

<u>Ascension (Acts 1:6-11</u> Let us pray for the Holy Church of God, that during this difficult time, she may strive to live this command of Jesus.

<u>The Descent of the Holy Spirit (Acts 2:1-13)</u>. That our Holy Spirit may guide all those seeking to discover a vaccine for Covid-19. For ears to hear what message the Holy Spirit is seeking to teach us globally, as a church, as a family and individually during this Covid-19 time.

<u>Assumption of Mary into Heaven (Rev. 12:1)</u>. For all dying at this time especially those who cannot receive visits from their loved ones, that our Blessed Mother may comfort them.

<u>Crowing of Mary Queen of Heaven (Rev. 12:1)</u>. For all branches of government that they may work together to protect their people, feed the hungry and jumpstart the economy in a responsible and effective way. For church leaders that they may be filled with a spirit of creativity as they seek to serve their people during this time of Covid-19.

Luminous Mysteries – Thursday The Baptism of Jesus (Luke 3:21-22). May this time of Covid-19 be a time of new spiritual enlightenment. That we may see our prayer and service to others as a valid way of living out our baptism. For all adults awaiting to receive the Sacrament of Baptism and entrance into Full communion with our church. The Wedding Feast of Cana (John 2:1-12). For marriages and families who are finding that this Covid-19 time to be particularly stressful. For engaged couples who have had to postpone their special day or have a very small celebration.

<u>The Proclamation of the Kingdom of God (Luke</u> <u>4:14-15)</u>. For God's blessing on all who are proclaiming God's call for the hungry by providing and distributing food to the hungry.

<u>The Transfiguration (Luke 9:28-36)</u>. That through this time of 'global correction' many lives may be spiritually and materially transformed beginning with our own lives.

<u>The Institution of the Eucharist (Luke 22:19)</u>. That during this time of fasting from the Eucharist, that our prayer of spiritual communion may lead us to a deeper hunger to return to our church family and receive the Eucharist sacramentally.



The Ongoing Journey to Healing and Reconciliation – July 19, 2021

As Canadians reflect on how we can respond to the pain and suffering experienced by survivors of residential schools and their loved ones, the Archdiocese of Toronto is committed to being directly engaged in the ongoing journey of truth and reconciliation. While the archdiocese did not operate residential schools, we have a responsibility to take genuine and meaningful steps to journey with Indigenous communities on the path to reconciliation, and to assist in healing the trauma experienced from the residential school system.

We are currently establishing working groups, each enriched by Indigenous

voices, to help guide and support our efforts. To that end, the archdiocese has identified the following priorities:

- Education –initiatives to educate our clergy, staff and the faithful regarding the tragic legacy of residential schools and its continuing impact on Indigenous people, and to develop a greater understanding and appreciation of Indigenous spirituality.
- Outreach and Spiritual support –initiatives to support survivors of residential schools and those suffering intergenerational trauma. These may include healing circles, personal or group counselling, workshops, speakers, listening sessions, opportunities for prayer, reconciliation services, and other spiritual supports.
- **Financial support** the Archdiocese of Toronto is developing a financial campaign to support ongoing healing and reconciliation efforts. A diverse working group will assist in formulating the campaign framework and related details in the weeks ahead. In response to those who have expressed a desire to contribute immediately, the Healing & Reconciliation fund has been established. Donations can be made online (https://bit.ly/healingreconciliation), by phone (416) 934-3411 or through any Catholic church in the Archdiocese of Toronto.

We recognize the journey to reconciliation is one that will continue for years to come. As we reflect on the role of the Catholic Church in operating residential schools, we echo the words of the Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate in 1991:

"We apologize for the existence of the schools themselves, recognizing that the biggest abuse was not what happened in the schools, but that the schools themselves happened...We wish to apologize in a very particular way for the instances of physical and sexual abuse that occurred in those schools...Far from attempting to defend or rationalize these cases of abuse in any way, we wish to state publicly that we acknowledge they were inexcusable, intolerable and a betrayal of trust in one of its most serious forms. We deeply and very specifically, apologize to every victim of such abuse and we seek help in searching for means to bring about healing."
